- 3. MARKETING AND SALES OF COMPOST PRODUCTION

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A. BACKGROUND

The Southeastern Connecticut Regional Resources Recovery Authority ("SCRRRA") is comprised of twelve member municipalities in Southeastern Connecticut and was created in 1984 by joint resolution of those municipalities. The Authority is responsible for implementing solid waste recovery systems, recycling and disposal services. SCRRRA owns property in Preston, Connecticut and leases a portion of it to ReWorld for the operation of a waste to energy ("WTE") facility.

SCRRRA provides single stream recycling with a private vendor for its member towns. The Authority provides additional waste management services to the towns of the southeastern portion of the state including household hazardous waste collections, recycling contracts for commodities processed through town transfer stations, and ongoing recycling education. The Authority owns and operates a horizontal wood grinder and associated equipment. It provides this service to the member towns and provides wood and brush reduction into chip wood for useful mulch by the towns and removal of the excess production.

The Authority provides recycling services to the 12 member municipalities transfer stations for the following commodities that are collected there: used motor oil and antifreeze, freon, fluorescent bulbs, batteries, and tires and textiles. The Authority also coordinates several state-mandated programs for the recycling of paint, mattresses and consumer electronics.

In addition to the transfer station support, the Authority provides 9 household hazardous waste collections at events throughout the SCRRRA region at no cost to the residents. Those events also offer free paper shredding.

The Authority is also responsible for the environmental monitoring of a closed landfill located in Montville, Connecticut.

The population base of the 12 member municipalities serviced by the Authority is approximately 240,000, including the U.S. Submarine Base and U.S. Coast Guard Academy. See Schedule I. Details of the waste stream produced are shown on Schedule II.

B. SCOPE OF PROJECT

In this Request for Qualifications ("RFQ"), SCRRRA is seeking Statements of Qualification ("SOQ") from experienced firms interested in providing food scrap customer solicitation and hauling, organics compost facility ("OCF") management and operations, manufacturing expertise, marketing and product sales services to an OCF being constructed by SCRRRA. See Schedule III.

It is the Authority's preference that a singular entity be involved in and responsible for all the categories of services referenced in paragraph one, and further, will perform those services with their own staff and employees, as opposed to sub-contractors.

At its sole and absolute discretion, the Authority may select a Respondent for any grouping of the service categories for which SOQ's were submitted if it meets SCRRRA's needs.

C. KEY PROJECT DETAILS

- 1. The Authority owns an approximate 23-acre parcel of cleared land adjacent to the ReWorld Waste to Energy facility in Preston Connecticut.
- 2. The Authority has successfully concluded a 6-month pilot test using aerobic static pile composting which is the technology that will be employed in the facility.
- 3. The Authority has a wood grinding operation and the availability of approximately 60,000 yards of wood chips that it produces annually.
- 4. The Authority has filed with the State of Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection ("DEEP") for a permit to operate the facility on the site.
- 5. The DEEP permit request is being processed and any DEEP concerns are being addressed. Final approval is expected by the first quarter of 2025.
- 6. The Authority has applied for and received approval from the Town of Preston for siting the facility.
- 7. SCRRRA plans to provide most of the operating equipment required. The Authority will own the facility and the facility equipment. The Respondent will be responsible for operating and maintaining the facility and equipment.
- 8. The Authority does not currently expect any material financial commitment for the construction of the facility by the interested parties for this RFQ.
- The State of Connecticut has a statute requiring that all large-scale producers of food
 waste (26+ tons/year) recycle their source separated organics at an authorized composting
 facility.
- 10. The construction of the OCF is not part of this RFQ. SCRRRA will issue a separate RFP for its construction pending receipt of certain key approvals.
- 11. SCRRRA will retain operation of the scale and receiving process.
- 12. The Respondent will be responsible for billing hauling services to customers (subscription), and, in addition to operating the facility, marketing and sale of compost product.

Post selection, the Authority will commence negotiations of specific contract terms with the selected Respondents. The final contract agreement will be subject to SCRRRA Board approval.

G. SOQ SPECIFIC SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The Authority requires that each submission specifically respond in detail to the following:

- 1. A minimum of three (3) years' experience in operating and maintaining this type of compost technology, preferably in the New England and/or Northeast region.
- 2. A minimum of three (3) years in marketing this type of compost product in the Connecticut and Southeastern New England region.
- 3. Detail on food scrap hauling equipment owned by the Respondent and its availability for a project this size.
- 4. Experience and descriptive approach for developing a food scrap customer base for both commercial, residential and town transfer accounts.
- Description of the hurdles experienced in developing this type of compost facility and market.
- 6. List at least three clients to whom these types of services have been provided, in whole or part, and describe in detail.

H. SOQ GENERAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Each submission is required to provide the following information:

- 1. Submittal letter, signed by a person authorized to execute a future agreement with SCRRRA on behalf of the Respondent. The letter should include at least the following:
 - a. Title of the RFQ
 - b. Name of the Respondent
 - c. Legal structure of the Respondent
 - d. Submission date.
- 2. Background and Experience of the Respondent.
 - a. Describe the Respondent's experience with organizations like the Authority and municipalities in the last five (5) years.

- b. List the principal individuals within Respondent's entity who will be involved in the various aspects of the services being sought for the project, their roles and backgrounds.
- c. Any additional information that the Respondent believes is pertinent to this project, the RFQ and SCRRRA's evaluation.
- 3. Provide up to three (3) references for whom the Respondent provides similar services including the organization, location and a brief description of the service(s); the name and title of the reference along with contact information.
- 4. Respondents shall provide a brief description of all litigation, brought against its entity and principals, all enforcement actions or penalties assessed by any regulatory agency having jurisdiction over permit compliance, worker health and safety, labor laws, or affirmative action, and any contract penalties related to service assessed by towns during the period from January 2000 to the present. Respondents shall also provide information and outcome of any investigations conducted by the State or Federal governments regarding their operations during the same period.
- 5. Respondents must provide a statement that they are an Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action Employer, and comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Equal Employment Act of 1972, and the Connecticut Fair Employment Practices Law.
- 6. A copy of the Respondent's current certificate of insurance showing insurance coverage levels.
- 7. Dates that SCRRRA may schedule a visit to tour one of the Respondent's facilities.

I. SOQ SUBMITTAL PROCESS

Sealed SOQs shall be submitted to the offices of SCRRRA, 7 Hurlbutt Road Suite O, Gales Ferry, Connecticut 06335, in accordance with the RFQ Timeline in this document.

The Authority reserves the right to reject any SOQs received after the deadline date.

The submission should contain three (3) hard copies and one (1) electronic copy in PDF format.

The execution page should be directed at Mr. David Aldridge, Executive Director, SCRRRA.


